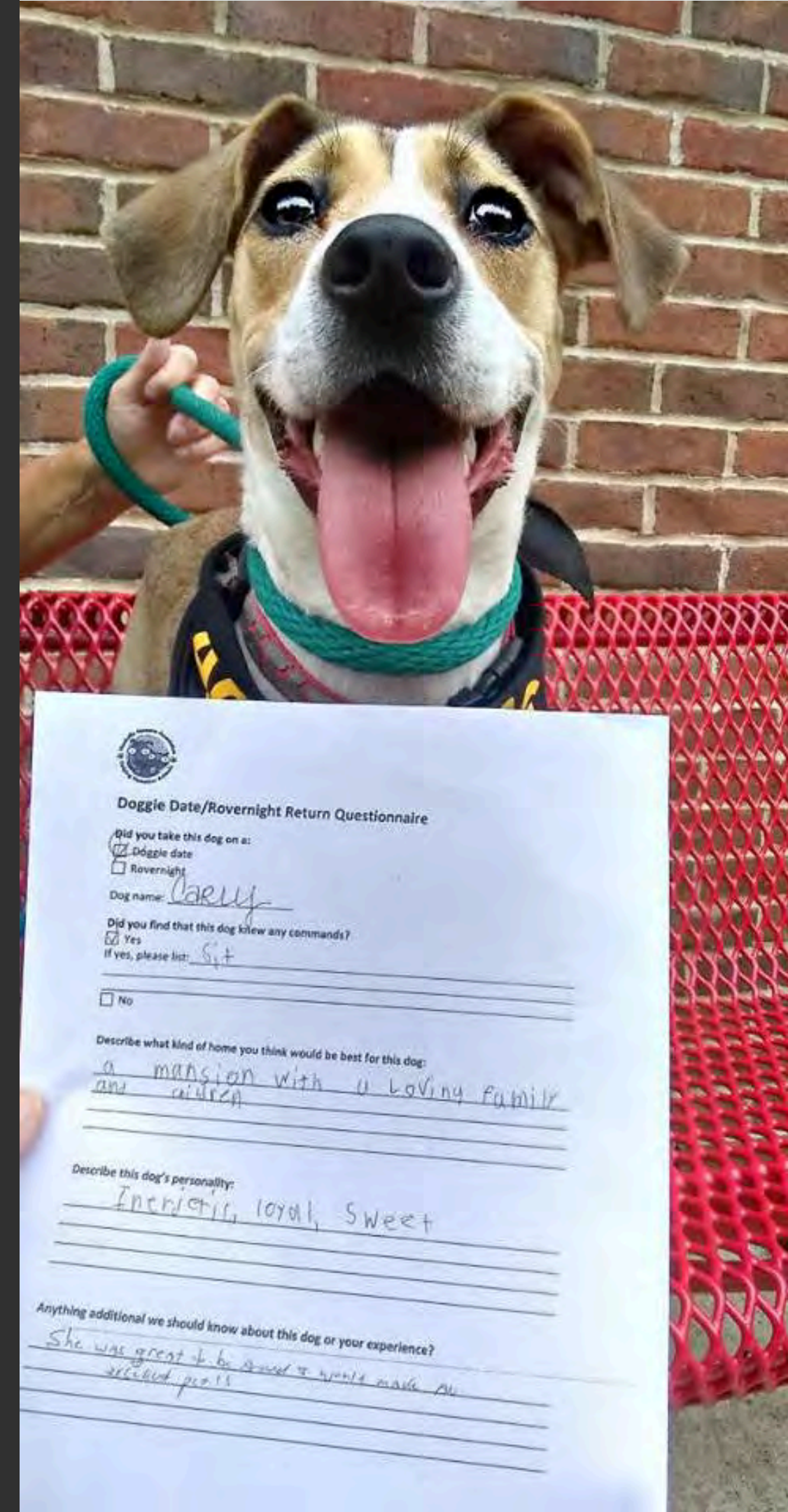

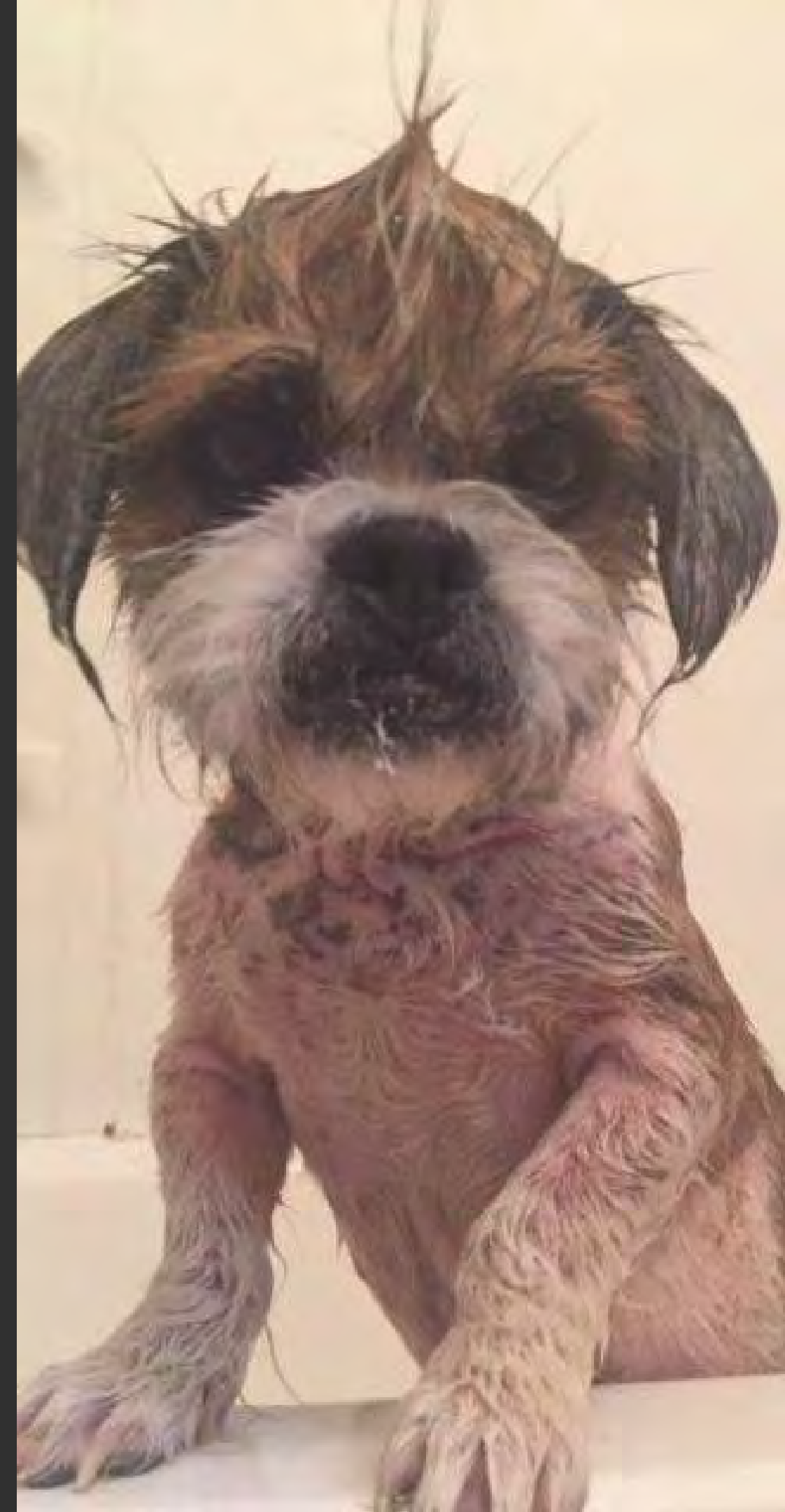
Creation of Emergency Medical Fund
