






### NHA Foster Program

In 2018, we created a new short term foster program to engage fosters and give our pets some much needed relief from shelter stress. With our new Doggie Dates and Rovernights program, we were able to engage the public, NHA's email server actually broke after we received more than 700 inquiries. Within the first week we were booked for the first 90 Doggie Date appointments.



#### Creation of Emergency Medical Fund


The combination of a full-time Chief Medical Officer and our new Emergency Medical fund allowed us to help more atrisk animals than ever before.

#### 95 Animals:


...and animals that needed additional care including amputations to critical life-saving surgeries.




