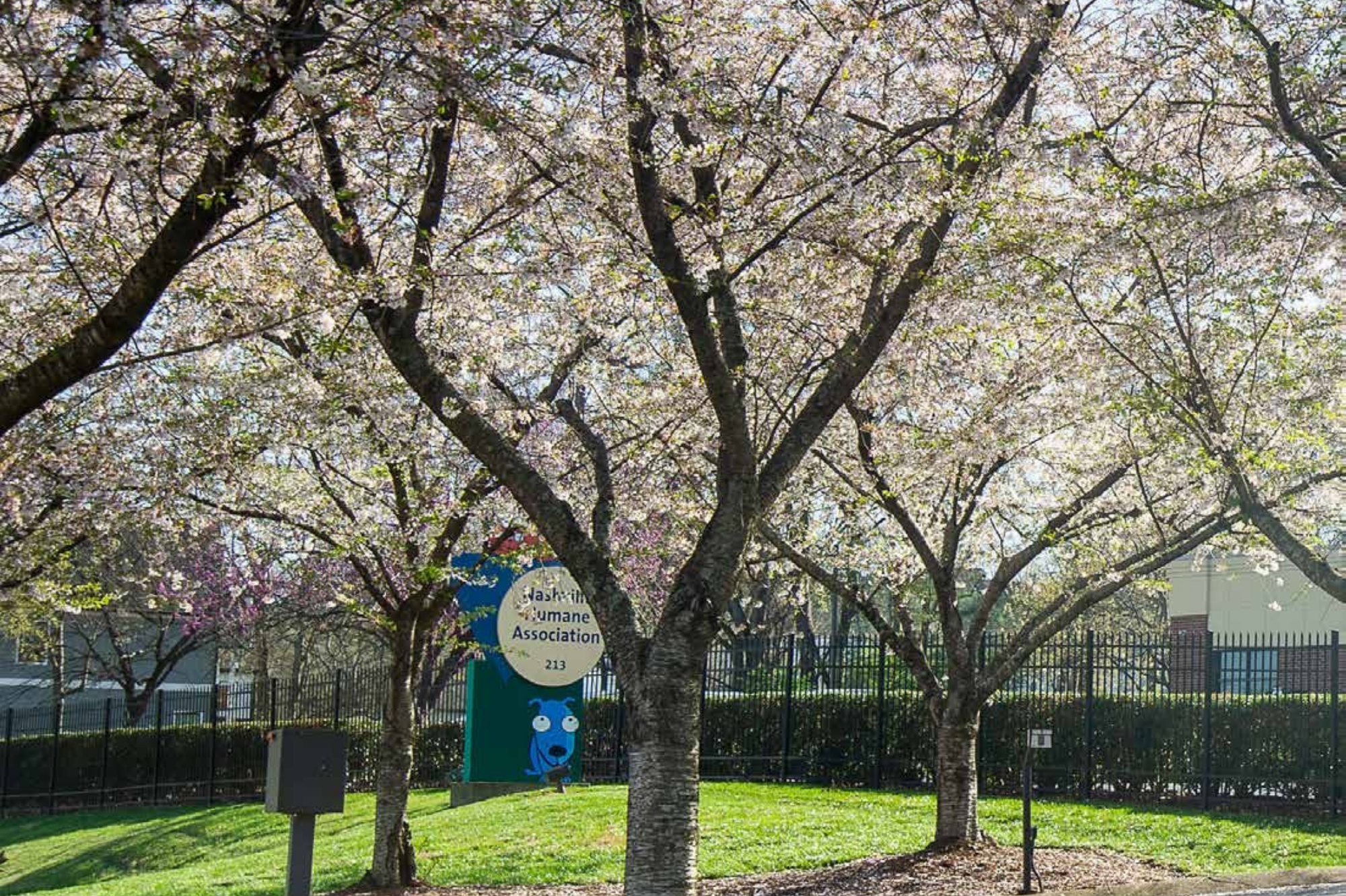

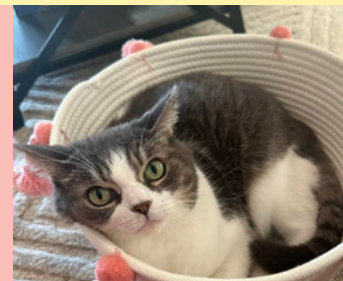

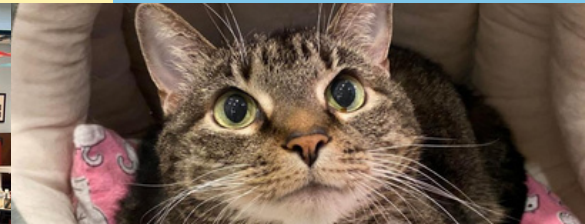

Since 1946, Nashville Humane has been helping homeless and adoptable dogs and cats find their forever homes here in our middle Tennessee community. We have helped generations find their family pet and we're proud to be the ones you think of when you go to adopt in our community. This year we helped more than 3,400 pets find their special someones and had a save rate of 99% for the sixth year in a row!

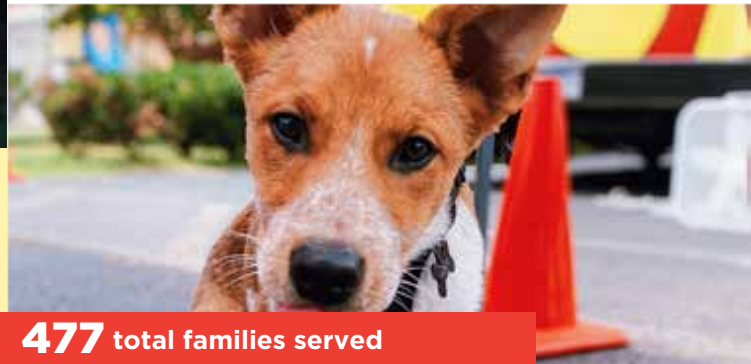


LOW-COST CLINICS

Beginning in the summer of 2022, Nashville Humane piloted a series of low-cost Vaccine and Microchip Clinics across Davidson County. Our mission as NHA is to not only help amazing pets find forever homes, but also support our unbelievable pet-loving community. Many families simply do not vaccinate or microchip because these services can be expensive if performed in a Vet office.

If Nashville Humane can help provide a

safe, accessible, and affordable microchip and vaccine solution to the public, then we're keeping pets safe, healthy, and in their homes and out of shelters... right where they belong! We are driven to provide these essential services to our community and help remove barriers to pet ownership. Moving forward into 2024, thanks to your local support and a \$10,000 grant from the Banfield Foundation, NHA will be able to expand these clinics and offer them monthly for an entire year!

Waggin' Wheels

Waggin' Wheels, our newest mobile adoption unit, will allow for us to bring adoptable animals into Davidson County and beyond. We believe that adopting a pet is one of the biggest joys in life and want to make this experience accessible to all of our community members. Waggin' Wheels was a dream in 2021 that was generously funded by our supporters and the Cartwright family. This specialty vehicle was built from the ground up to provide comfort and care to adoptable



animals; think of the finest food truck but for adoptable furry friends! The Waggin' Wheels inaugural adoption event was a Tiny But Mighty event that resulted in a pup finding his forever family. Mobile adoptions are volunteer-led which helps us make every dollar stretch while providing the best service to our two-legged and four-legged clients.



Cause For Paws

Nashville Humane Association has four signature events that help raise funds and awareness all while having a good time. The year kicked off with Unleashed Dinner With Your Dog: Championing the Underdog. This event raised over \$110,000 to put toward NHA's mission of improving animal welfare in middle Tennessee. In the Spring, there was Mutt Strutt - a 1-mile/5k with your dog and we had more than 500 participants and raised over \$48,000.



The next vital, signature event is Cause for Paws hosted at the Belle Meade Country Club. This is a fashion runway luncheon that featured the beautiful fashion designs of Shoshanna and a few cute pups. Dog Day, a family and pet friendly festival rounds out the events for the year. This all day event at Centennial Park had more than 5,000 visitors and featured dozens of animal-related vendors.

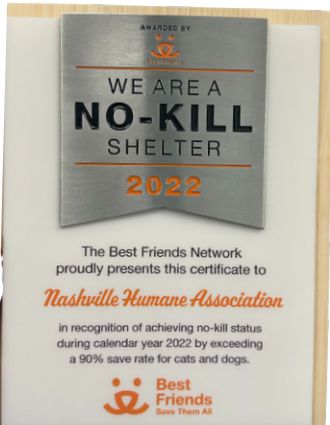

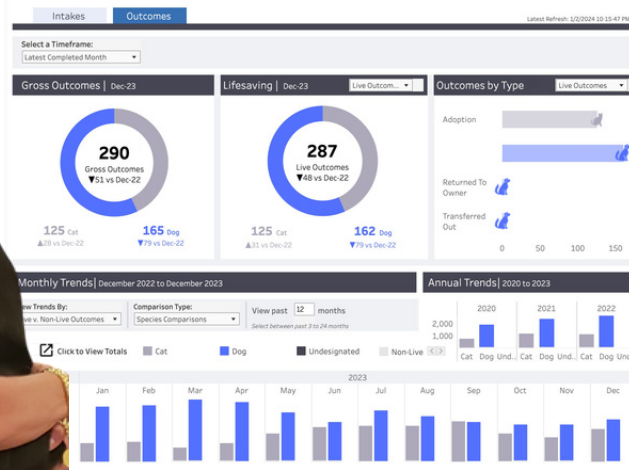

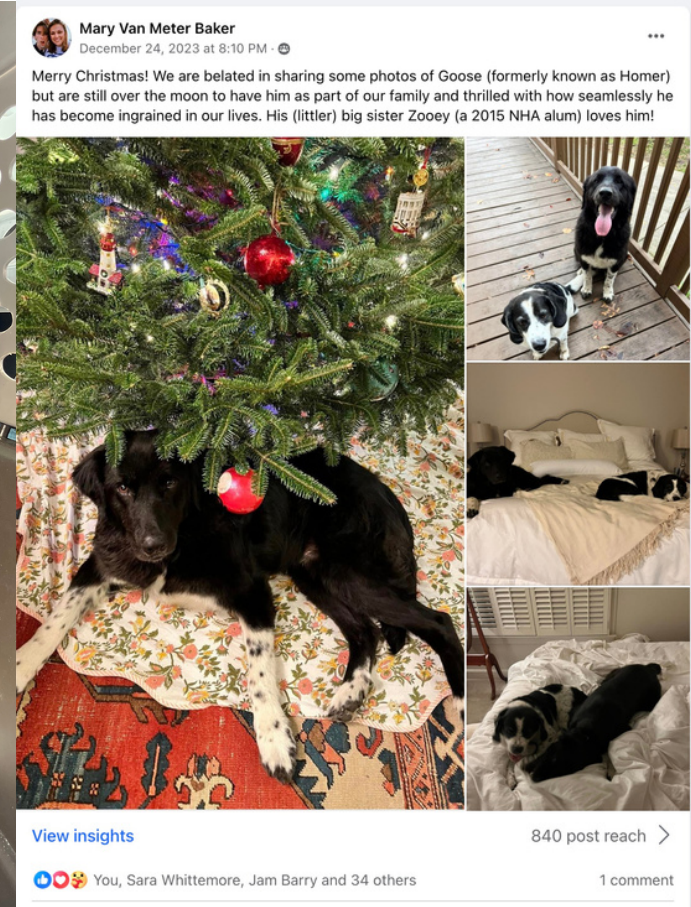
Nashville Humane Association believes in working collectively to share credible and accessible data to positively impact animals and communities. NHA participates in this process thanks to national data collecting organizations Shelter Animals Count and Shelter Pet Data Alliance. We are able to analyze data, compare national and state peer organization dashboards, be eligible for grant opportunities, and forecast trends.

In 2023, NHA saw an increase in medical and behavioral needs in the animals that entered the shelter doors. Over 3,500 animals came to NHA in need. Even though we serve thousands, every animal is seen as an individual. This is truly a high volume of animals to serve in a year, and we believe in providing high quality care to these dogs and cats until we can find their new family.

It was one of the hottest days of the year on July 3rd, 2023, when Homer, a hairless, uncomfortable hound came to Nashville Humane. He was in poor condition living under an abandoned house protecting two puppies, Bart and Lisa. Thanks to our amazingly talented Vet Services team, and your support, we were able to nurse them all back to health. By September, all of them, including Homer, now Goose, were healthy and happy and in a home. Dogs like Homer are tangible proof of both the resilient spirit of animals and the impact our programs can have on our community, again, thanks to YOU!

Montgomery County **TORNADO** **RELIEF EFFORTS**

On December 9th, 2023, an F-3 tornado hit middle Tennessee. Nashville Humane swiftly went into action and started gathering supplies to support Montgomery County Animal Services. Their immediate needs were donations of wire crates, soft bedding, and dog food. NHA delivered more than a van's worth of supplies. While delivering donations, NHA pulled 17 dogs and cats to help make room for displaced animals.

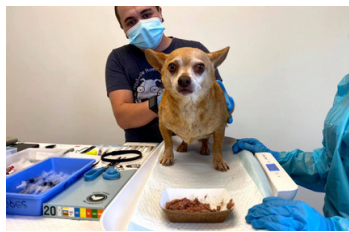
Chunk, an adorable lowriding dog, was one of those dogs. In a matter of days, he became fully vetted and adopted by an NHA volunteer. What a difference a day, or two, can make.

Nashville Humane continued to provide disaster relief support via a free vaccination and microchip clinic for Montgomery County residents and those affected by the tornado. Over 100 animals were serviced and all of these efforts were fully grant-funded thanks to our generous supporters including Pedigree Foundation, Tito's Handmade Vodka, and Mutt Nation Foundation.

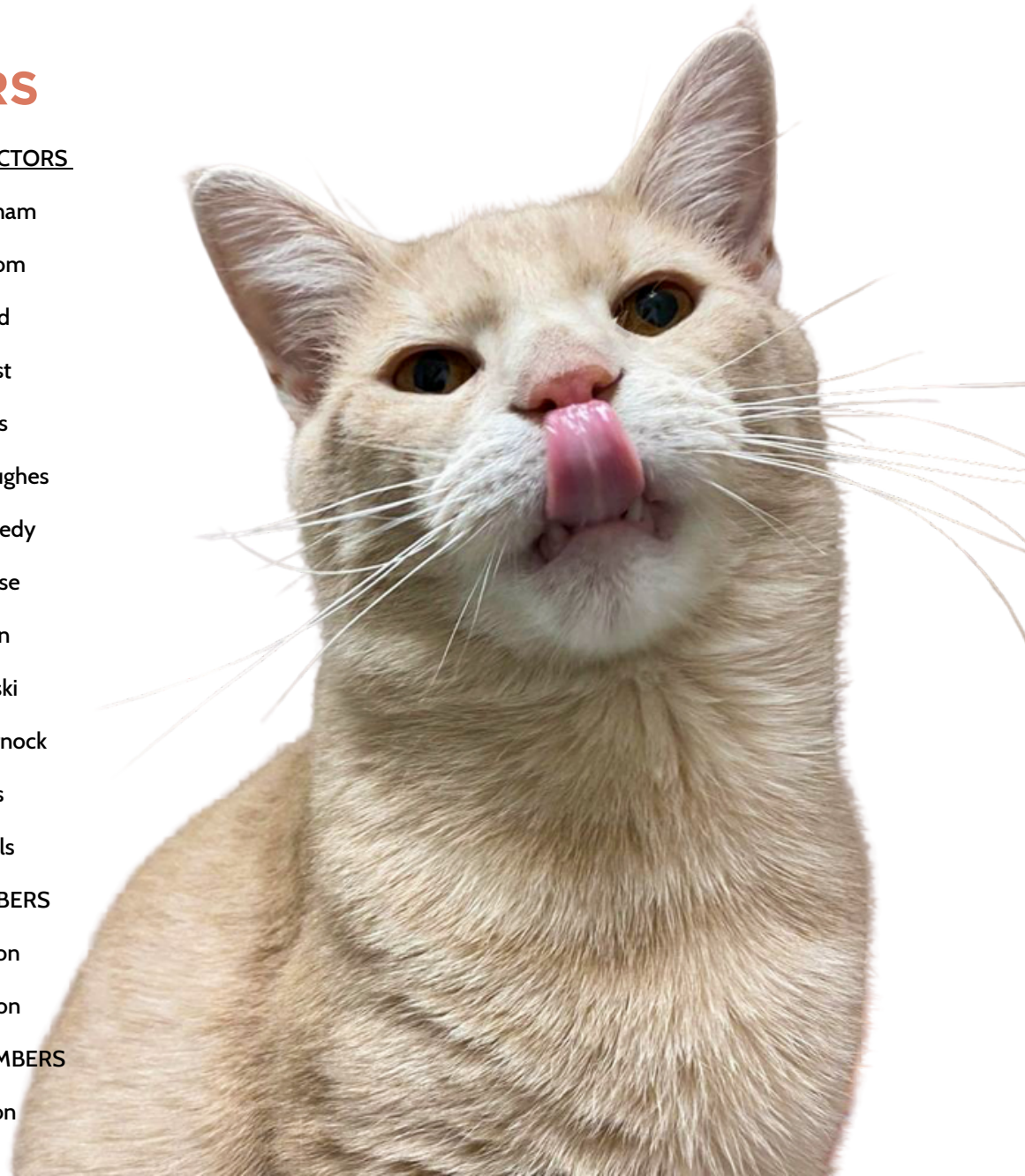
